## Finding Your Fit in Global Mission

*Lecturer to share a wealth of mission experiences...with more to come.*

A free expo and workshops surrounding the theme, "Finding Your Fit in Global Mission" will be offered at the College on Saturday 18th September, 9-5pm. Presented by David Turnbull, Senior Lecturer of Intercultural Studies and a doctoral student at Flinders University, the day promises to provide a plethora of information from different mission agencies as well as ways to both support and be involved in cross-cultural mission.

David's own experience in global mission began when his family spent six years in Papua New Guinea. These years were influential in developing a strong interest

in global mission. For the past three decades David has been involved with global mission in many ways: working with international students; supporting and training cross-cultural workers and working in Papua New Guinea and Nigeria (Gindiri College of Theology). He has also completed a Master's Degree in World Religions, and is a committee member of local church mission groups and peak bodies of Australian mission agencies such as Missions Interlink.

Currently involved in the Australian Committee of Lausanne World Committee for World Evangelisation, David is excited

### 16 Sept: Reaksa Himm.

Reaksa survived the Khmer Rouge horror of the late 70's in Cambodia when he lost 13 members of his family and struggled with what to do with his life from that point on. He went to Canada as a refugee and became a Christian, eventually returning to Cambodia to find two of his family's killers and offer his forgiveness. He has since built a school in that same community in Cambodia. Today there are 6 churches in that area; a testimony to the power of forgiveness.

### 23 Sept: Dr Yi-An Neoh and Mike Hey.

Both Dr Neoh and Mike Hey have spent time with the ships ministry of Operation Mobilisation, with Mike being the OM Leader of the ministry on the *Logos Hope*. They share their stories.

### 14th Oct: Carmen Haywood.

Carmen is a translator assistant of the Mayoyao New Testament in the Philippines, a Pastor and head of the Pastor's fraternity amongst her own people.

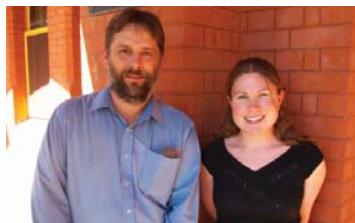

to be attending the Third Lausanne Congress for World Evangelisation, to be held in Cape Town this year. He and Mel Foster, (adjunct lecturer in the area of mission and culture in YITS), will be traveling to the Congress in October.



Explains Turnbull, "The primary aim is to call the global church to wrestle with the contemporary challenges, and to call the church to a fresh proclamation of the gospel in order that we might be better equipped as God's witnesses in every aspect of society in the 21st century."

Both Foster and Turnbull will join the Australian delegation of 45 and be part of the 4,000 delegates from over 200 nations and territories. The conference material may be developed into a subject within the School of Ministry, Theology and Culture program.
