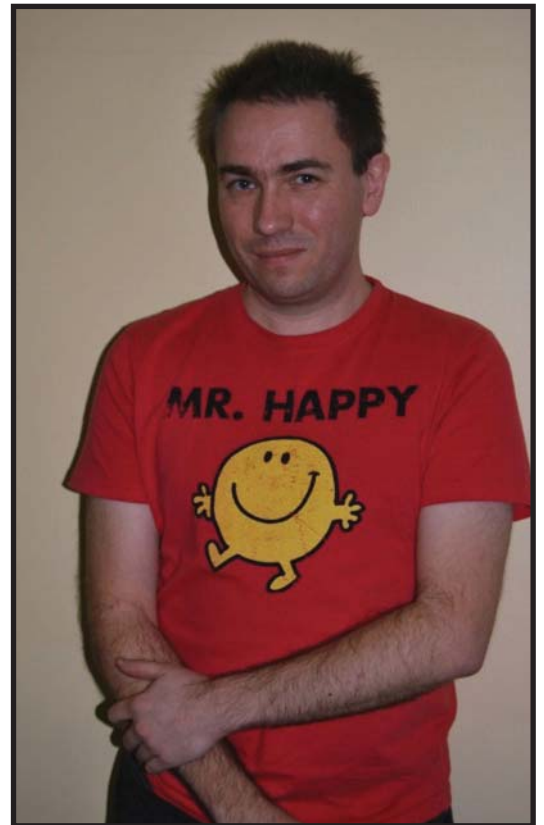
## Fostering Community: SRC President Reflects on Life at Tabor

At its first meeting for the semester, the Student Representative Council unanimously elected Peter Loveday as SRC President for the next year. Despite becoming a very recent father Peter graciously agreed to share his journey at Tabor Adelaide and his passion for student involvement in campus life, with *Liberamente*.

My journey at Tabor commenced when I began studying a Bachelor of Theology part time at the beginning of this year. Upon deciding to study theology last year, I investigated a variety of options, and attended a number of open days, finally deciding on Tabor. This decision was based on a variety of factors: the non-denominational nature and acceptance of a broad range of viewpoints and ideas, the flexibility of the courses and elective options, the excellent online learning resources and feeling of community here. God also placed several other factors in place that reinforced for me that this was where I was meant to study.

While I find my studies extremely rewarding, it is always a balancing act. Between working, studying and recently having our first baby, it can be hard to fit everything in. I have found the need to prioritise somewhat to ensure I have enough time for family above all else, and to effectively work and study. Hobbies and other activities I have enjoyed in the past, such as involvement in church worship band, have had to be put on hold, for now.

As I recall I became interested in the SRC on my first day at Tabor; I have always wound up being directly involved in any organisation or group I am a part of - often as a result of finding it frustrating when I can see things that I feel should be done or improved. The SRC has several ongoing projects, such as improving IT facilities (like wireless internet), adding Tabor students' voices to the call to re-open Millswood train station, and holding community building events such as sausage sizzles, sports, etc. - Our next event will be on Tuesday 10th Nov from 12-1pm - we'll have icypoles, volleyball and frisbee, so please come along. A special thanks to all who ran in the City to Bay this year sporting their Tabor T-shirts. Several reports have come back of people striking up conversations about Tabor and its programmes. The crowds on the day meant it was difficult for everyone to meet up afterward (30,000 people on the Glenelg foreshore!). As far as we are aware there were no injuries to our runners and walkers and all enjoyed the day.

Former education student and elite female runner Claire Ashworth finished in a very strong 43:28. Mark Worthing managed to win his age category with a time of 46:42 and our first current Tabor student across the line was Geoffrey Worthing with a time of 49:29. Newlyweds Ben and Jess Morton crossed the line together as walkers in 2:00:02 – not bad as they were aiming for “about two hours.” Chris Powell was also very precise at predicting his time. He said he planned to run a training run in one hour and finished with exactly a 60:00 – now that’s pace awareness!

Also, we’d like to thank Ben Morton for the very eye-catching shirt design (as modelled in the photo).

Next year we hope to have an even bigger group of runners and walkers, and perhaps our own recovery tent at the finish. So remember, it’s not too late to start training for next year...

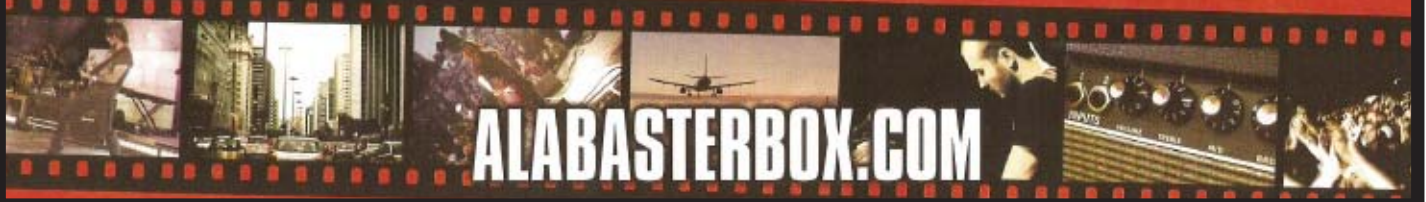

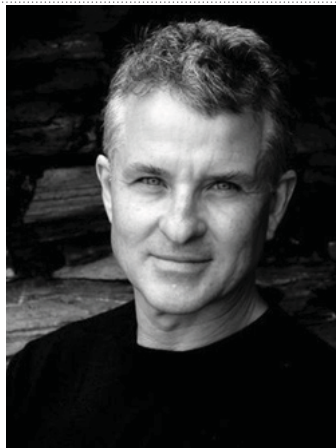

Virginia Lakeman, who is currently studying for a Masters in Composition, entered a short 6 minute work, 'Bounce' for string quartet in a competition run by the Australian String Quartet. The competition had two aims; one was to encourage University composition students to write for string quartet, and the other was to have a new work suitable to be played by the quartet as an encore in their public concerts in Australia and when on tour around the world. Of the entries received six were chosen, including 'Bounce' to be workshopped with the composers and then performed in a free concert.



During the workshop the members of the quartet gave feedback to the composers about their work. This allowed for some re-editing prior to the concert at Elder Hall on the 22nd August. At the start of this concert the leader of the Australian String Quartet, Sophie Rowell, announced that the players enjoyed playing all six works and had decided that all would be performed at different times in coming concerts as encores. In fact four of them were performed on Friday 11th September in a public concert. A recording of the live performance was made, and copies given to each composer. Anyone who would like to hear 'Bounce' is welcome to contact Virginia.
